



Lesson Aim: To take a close look at Who Jesus is and why He came.

Prayer: Ask the Holy Spirit to lead your personal study time and/or discussion.

Icebreaker: How many generations back can you trace your personal family history?

- 1. **READ Luke 3:23-37**. In this genealogy, which names stand out to you? What do you know about them?
- 2. **READ Luke 3:21-22.** How did Jesus identify with humanity through His baptism? What happens at Jesus' baptism that sets Him apart from humanity?
- 3. **READ Matthew 3:13-17.** What do you notice about John's attitude in the presence of Jesus? Why does John have this kind of attitude? (also **READ John 1:29-34**)
- 4. What makes it difficult for you to cultivate this kind of attitude of humility and worship before Jesus? What can help you to cultivate this kind of attitude?
- 5. What is significant about John calling Jesus "the lamb of God"? (also cf. Exodus 12:10-13 & Isaiah 53:7) How has this been significant to you personally?
- 6. One of the principles from Pastor Scott's message Sunday was that *Jesus was one of us*. **READ Hebrews 2:17-18 & 4:14-16**. What in these verses do you find most encouraging about Jesus becoming one of us?
- 7. How can understanding the implications of Jesus becoming one of us help you as you face trials & temptations?
- 8. Jesus is fully human but He is also fully God. **READ Colossians 2:9-10 & Hebrews 1:3**. At times, what people (or forces) seem to be more powerful than Jesus? Why?
- 9. How do you respond to the fact that even these people/forces are under Christ's authority? How can that make a difference in your life this week?

Close in prayer as the Lord leads you.

Luke 3:21 – 38

► QUESTION: Who is this guy, anyway?

► ANSWER: He is <u>fully man</u> and, at the same time, <u>fully God</u>. (Colossians 2:9)

HUMANITY (Luke 3:23-38) – Seen in His Family Tree / Genealogy

- Matthew's genealogy goes <u>forward</u>; Luke goes <u>backward</u>
- Matthew goes forward from Abraham to Jesus; Luke goes backward from Jesus to Adam

PRINCIPLE #1: Jesus was one of us!

3 This is not the same genealogy as Matthew 1

PRINCIPLE #2: Jesus was man as God meant men to be.

DIVINITY (Luke 3:21-22) – Seen at His Baptism (cf. Matthew 3:13-17; Mark 1:11-13)

- Jesus came from Galilee to be baptized at the Jordan River
- John the Baptist tried to resist baptizing Jesus
- Jesus insisted & John baptized Him
- Jesus was praying as He came up out of the water
- Heaven opened & the Spirit descended upon Christ in the form of a dove
- The voice of the Father affirmed Jesus' unique Sonship
- Jesus left His baptism full of the Holy Spirit (Luke 4:1)
- ► Three Main Things to Notice:
- Jesus was <u>disqualified</u> & <u>qualified</u> for baptism (Matthew 3:13-15; John 8:46; 2 Cor. 5:21)
- 2 The Spirit came upon Jesus in physical form
 - Dove = Symbol of <u>peace</u>, <u>purity</u>, innocence, loveliness & <u>new beginnings</u>
- 3 The voice of the Father attested to Jesus' perfect Sonship
 - "You are my Son, whom I love; with You I am well-pleased" (Luke 3:22b)

PRINCIPLE #3: The most important thing in life is to <u>agree</u> with the <u>Father</u> in His <u>assessment</u> of His Son.

PRINCIPLE #4: The second most important thing is to <u>seek</u> a <u>similar approval</u> from God yourself! (1 John 3:3)
