Luke 7:1 - 10

THE SCENE

- WHEN? <u>Right after preaching the Sermon on the Plain</u>
- WHERE? <u>Capernaum</u>
- WHO? Unnamed centurion
 - → He was very <u>sympathetic</u> to the <u>Jewish</u> religion
 - → He <u>financed</u> the <u>construction</u> of the local synagogue
 - → He was <u>unusually compassionate</u> toward his <u>servant</u>

PRINCIPLE #1: Faith is generally birthed out of a desperate need.

• WHAT? <u>Healing</u> at a <u>distance</u>

REMARKABLE FAITH

- → He had opportunity to hear about Jesus
- → He knew about Jesus' miraculous power
- → He had witnessed Jesus <u>change</u> people's <u>lives</u>
- → He knew of a case when Jesus had healed at a distance

PRINCIPLE #2: The <u>value</u> of your faith is dependent upon how well you know the <u>object</u> of your faith. (cf. 2 Peter 3:18) PRINCIPLE #3: When you have true faith, you are willing to live for

God's purposes as you trust Him to take care of

your needs.

LET'S AMAZE JESUS TODAY

(Mark 6:5-6 ; Luke 7:9-10; Matthew 8:10-13; Hebrews 11:6)

→ Deep <u>humility</u>

+ confident \underline{trust} in Christ

+ leaning into spiritual authority

= Pleasing / Amazing God

Lesson Aim: To grow in our understanding and application of what it means to have a growing faith in our great God.

Prayer: Ask the Holy Spirit to lead your personal study time and/or discussion.

- A central part of today's passage from Luke 7 is the faith of the Roman centurion. READ Matthew 27:26, 54; 28:4, 11-15; Acts 10:2; 23:17-18; 27:43. How are Roman centurions portrayed elsewhere in Scripture?
- 2. **READ Luke 7:1-10.** In your own words, describe the centurion in this story.
- 3. On what basis did the elders request help from Jesus?
- 4. How did their approach differ from the centurion's (vs. 6-8)? How does this relate to what Jesus says in verse 9?

- 5. Why do you think the Centurion said, "I do not deserve to have you come under my roof"? What things has Jesus done for you that you didn't deserve?
- 6. What are some things that people sometimes think they deserve from God? Are they right or wrong? Why?
- 7. The Centurion's authority was over soldiers, and they had to do what he told them. Over what did he think Jesus had authority? Was he right?
- 8. Describe a time when you surrendered control of a situation and let God accomplish His purposes.
- 9. Are there any areas of your life from which you need to release control to Jesus? How might you go about doing that? What is one step you could take in the right direction?

Close in prayer as the Lord leads you.
