INTRODUCTION

- ► Prayer is a mysterious thing
- ▶ We all need to grow in this area of our spiritual life
- ▶ Prayer really matters... it changes things (James 5:16)

MECHANICS OF PRAYER - WE PRAY...

- <u>To</u> the <u>Father</u> (Matthew 6:9)
- ❷ In the <u>name</u> of the <u>Son</u> (John 14:6,13-14)
- In the <u>power</u> of the <u>Holy Spirit</u> (Romans 8:26-27; Ephesians 6:18; Jude 20-21)
- Boldly (Luke 11:5-8; Hebrews 4:16)
- With <u>faith</u> (Mark 11:22-24; Luke 11:9-10)
- On <u>all occasions</u> (Ephesians 6:18)
- Without <u>ceasing</u> (Luke 18:1; 1 Thessalonians 5:17)
- S According to God's will (James 4:1-3)

CORE BELIEF: We believe prayer is <u>conversation</u> with God, seeking His <u>power</u> to <u>align</u> ourselves & our world with His will.

CORE VALUE: Therefore we will pray to <u>align ourselves</u> with God's will, expecting His <u>power</u> to <u>change</u> our world.

VISION FOR THE FUTURE: Prayer Involvement
